#### Froebel: **Block Play**



Our Block Play has continued to develop and grow and we would love to share this with you. Block play is one of Froebel's occupations and supports and promotes all areas of development.

Children can play cooperatively or on their own. Sometimes when children begin on their own they join up their play with others in the area.

• Children can create structures in play with the blocks - reflections, rotations and translations - that supports later more abstract understanding of geometry.

• Blocks encourage symmetrical building - giving children the opportunity to explore symmetry in far greater depth.

• Blocks provide opportunities to learn about size, shape and measurement - by beginning to use a standard unit, to equivalence, quantity, sorting, matching and problem-solving.

#### Skill of the Month: Numbers



Numeracy is not just about being able to count. It is about developing number sense which encourages creativity of thought and it allows children to interact with the world around them. We have been exploring numbers in our everyday activities and encouraging our children to recognise that symbols have different meaning in different contexts and to understand quantity.

MNU 0-02a I have explored numbers, understanding that they represent quantities and can use them to count, create sequences and describe order.

#### French



We have been learning some words in French. We have also learned a new French song, Bonjour. Ask me to sing this to you at home.

#### Literacy: Makaton



We have been learning about different ways in which we can communicate. One way we have been exploring is using Makaton signs. Makaton is a way of communicating using signs and symbols. It is used by over 100,000 adults and children.

Makaton has been shown to be useful for all sorts of people including those who struggle with understanding concepts, those who have poor literacy skills, including grammatical knowledge, and

those with English as an Additional Language. By using Makaton, children and adults can take a more active part in life, because communication and language are the key to everything we do and learn.

Each week we will introduce two different signs. We have already learned to say, hello, thank you, good morning, happy and sad.

LITO-014a I use signs, books or other texts to find useful or interesting information and I use this to plan, make choices or learn new things.

Please ask your child to show you what signs they have learned.

#### Schemas



When children repeat patterns of behaviour and actions this is known as <u>schematic play</u>. There are different types of schemas that have been identified and some children will often display them in play whilst others may not be so obvious. Children will repeat these behaviours and action to make sense of the world and to find out how things work.
