Staff coordinator roles




Each member of staff has a coordinator role, where they take the lead in developing this area within the nursery. The coordinator roles are:

Scissor Skills


Cutting is an essential skill for your child to learn and we will be focussing on cutting over the next few weeks. Practise really does make perfect so please join us at home if you can. Ways to support scissor skills at home are modelling and guiding the squeezing action and providing cardboard,

cooked spaghetti or paper for snipping and cutting along straight or wavy lines. If you child needs a challenge they could try cutting out pictures from a newspaper or magazine. (HWB 0-22a)

We have been learning and singing our Welcome Everyone song and the Bucket Filling song, please ask your child to sing these to you at home and you can join in too. Happy singing!


Each month we introduce a Makaton sign. This month we are learning the sign for Hello, Thank you and Snack.

Bucket Filling and PATHS





2 - Meet the PATHS puppets.

At Canberra we are Bucket Fillers. Being a Bucket Filler means that we are kind, caring and helpful to others. Why don't you try to fill as many buckets as you can! To help you do this you a can get ideas from the <u>A-Z Bucket Filling sheet</u>, or you could make up your own. **Please remember to share all your Bucket Filling with us!!** Lit-*09a*

To develop this further the school is introducing a programme named PATHS. The goal of the PATHS (Promoting Alternative THinking Strategies) is to lay the foundation for lifelong social emotional understanding. It aims to prevent emotional issues in young children and supports them in identifying and understanding their emotions and feelings. It is designed to help children to develop self control, positive self-esteem, emotional awareness and problem solving skills. This will be done through stories and puppets. We look forward to sharing our PATHS journey with you.

What I need in Nursery



If the weather is going to be bright and dry, we would appreciate if you could apply sun cream before bringing your child to nursery in the morning. Please ensure that they have a labelled bottle of sun cream in their nursery bag. We will reapply their sun cream after lunch. Children will only be

able to play outdoors in sunny weather if they have a sun hat. We can label and keep these items in nursery if you prefer.

Your child also needs:

An indoor pair of shoes (with name on).

A change of clothes(pants, socks, top and trousers).

If you can out your child's name or initials on their tops and jumper, this would really help us as a lot of children have similar clothes.

Froebel



Our practice in Canberra is very much influenced by Friedrich Froebel. Froebel was born in Germ any in 1972 and his work and pedagogy has shaped and influenced much of early years practice. Froebel's key principles are Respect, Community, Connectedness, Learning and Development, Creativity, Environment and well qualified practitioners. Froebel believed in the importance of first hand experiences and connecting with nature. We have developed several Froebel approaches, including block play, loose parts and outdoor play. We will continue to share with you in each of our newsletters how the se approaches help support the learning and development of your child.

Learning Journals



We use Learning Journals to share your child's learning and development. We do this through significant observations and stories, which are linked to the curriculum. We aim to share at least one observation and one story with you each week, which will also have suggestions on how you can support this learning at home too.

We would love for you to share your child's learning with us on Learning Journals. Please click the link below if you need any information on how to do this.



This month we would love for you to go on a number hunt. As you know numbers are all around us. We would like you to go out on a walk and find as many numbers as you can. We would then like you to share with us:


- Where did you find numbers on your number hunt?


